

# Diversified Fixed Interest option

Invests in a wide range of Australian and international bonds and loans. This is done through actively investing in the fixed interest and credit asset class sectors. Aims for capital stability and higher returns than cash over the short to medium term.

## Investment objective

To beat a composite of Australian and International Fixed Interest Indices over the short to medium term.

\*The composite consists of 50% Bloomberg Global Aggregate 1-5 Year Total Return Index hedged to AUD and 50% Bloomberg AusBond Composite 0-5 Year Index. Index level returns, adjusted for implied superannuation tax (where applicable).

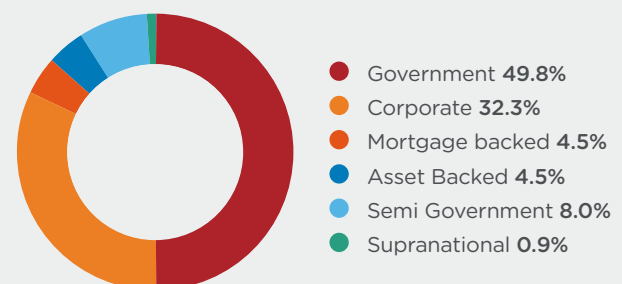
